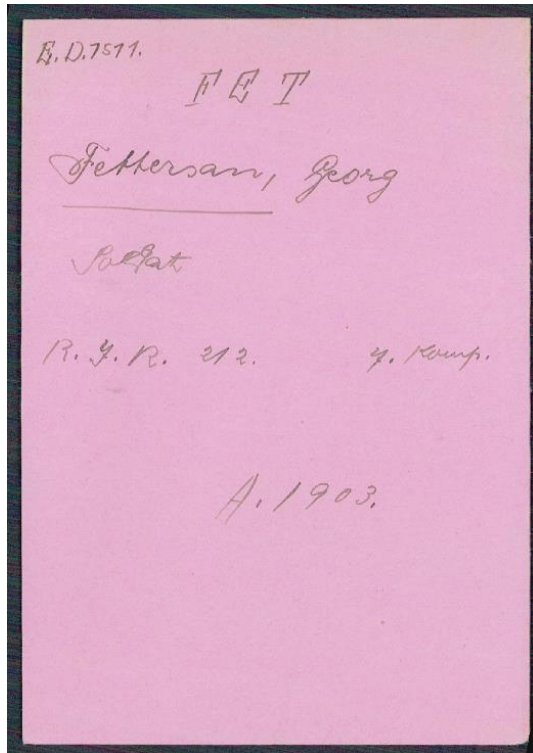


Georg Felterson (Fetterson)©

Regimental number: -

Reserve-Infanterie-Regiment Nr. 212

born: unknown - died: 29 June 1916



This soldier is recorded in the journal of the chaplains of No. 1 Canadian Casualty Clearing Station as Geo Felterson, a German protestant, who was a prisoner of war when he died at No. 1 CCCS on 29 June 1916.¹

He probably served in the 212th Reserve Infantry Regiment, which was part of the 45th Reserve Division.² The division fought on the Western Front and at the battle of Ypres in 1916. It remained there until September of that year.

Since Felterson is not a likely German name, this soldier may have been Georg Fetterson, who was recorded by the International Committee of the Red Cross as a prisoner of war.³
